## Online Safety Strategy



### Curriculum

Teaching pupils about online safety is interweaved throughout the Godolphin curriculum. Pupils are taught about online safety and harms, including what positive, healthy and respectful online relationships look like. Pupils learn about the effects of their online actions on others, and they are taught to recognise and display respectful behaviour online. Throughout the GJA curriculum, teachers will address online safety and will teach children about appropriate online behaviour in an age-appropriate way that is relevant to pupils' lives.



### Knowledge and Behaviours

Teachers will continually focus on the knowledge and behaviours pupils need to know to help them navigate the online world safely and confidently, regardless of the device, platform or app. This teaching is built into lessons across the curriculum as well as taught in specific safety lessons, workshops and events. This learning will include:



- **How to evaluate what they see online**
- **How to recognise techniques for persuasion**
- **Online behaviour**
- **Identifying online risks**
- **How and when to seek support**

### Staying Safe and Wellbeing

Teachers will stay equipped with knowledge and understanding of the risks online in order to tailor teaching to support the specific needs of pupils. Teaching children how to stay safe online will include educating pupils in the following areas:



- **Managing online information**
- **Copyright and ownership**
- **Privacy and security**
- **Online relationships**
- **Online reputation**
- **Online bullying**

We support and monitor pupil wellbeing as part of our online safety strategy and ensure pupils are provided with lessons and advice to avoid risks to their self-image and identity, their online reputation and online bullying.

### Whole School Approach

We are committed to teaching online safety through a whole school approach that permeates through our ethos, culture and environments. Godolphin is dedicated to working alongside all stakeholders and supporting families to ensure the principles of online safety are well communicated, taught and followed. Our online safety principles are reflected in procedures, practice and in key safeguarding policies.
